

# Layered Scallops Necklace

**Skill Level:**  EASY

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## Finished Measurements:

Approximately 14 ½ inches long or 36.8 cm (excluding bead clasp)

## Materials:

Cream cotton thread, size 8  
Burgundy cotton thread, size 8  
Size 6 steel crochet hook  
Silver cup beads  
Black cup beads  
Effervescent sequins (cupped)  
Old rose 1mm pearl beads  
1cm diameter black bead or matching color (for enclosure)  
Sewing needle with very small eye  
Sewing thread of matching color  
Scissors

## Lower Layer of Necklace:

**CL3 (3-dc cluster):** (YO, insert in sp, yo and draw up a lp. yo and through 2 lps on hook) 3 times in same sp, yo and draw through all 4 lps on hook.

With Burgundy, ch a multiple of 10+1 to desired length of necklace. Remember to allow at least 0.75

inch for bead placket. A loose choker length necklace is recommended.

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, 1 sc in each st across. Turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 5 (counts as 1 tr and 1 ch), (1 tr, ch 1) twice in first sc, skip 4 sc, 1 sc in next sc, \*ch 1, skip 4 sc, (1 tr, ch 1) 5 times in next sc, skip 4 sc, 1 sc in next sc; rep from \* to last 5 sc, skip 4 sc, (ch 1, 1 tr) 3 times in last sc. Turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, 1 sc in first tr, \*ch 2, [1 dtr, ch 2] 4 times in next sc between shells, 1 sc in center tr of next shell; rep from \*, end last rep with 1 sc in 4th ch of tch. Turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, 1 sc in first sc, \*ch 4, CL3 in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, CL3 in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 4, 1 sc in next sc; rep from \* to end. Ch 1, turn.

**Row 5:** \*4 sc in 4-ch sp, \*\*ch 4, sl st in 4<sup>th</sup> ch from hook (picot made), ch 3, insert hook thru back of picot, YO, pull through picot, YO, pull through 2 loops on hook, ch 3, sl st in base of picot (large picot made), 3 sc in 3-ch sp, rep from \*\* twice; 4 sc in 4-ch sp. Rep from \* to end. **Do not** fasten off, do not turn.

### **Button Placket:**

(Worked along the end of the necklace. Remember that the placket adds length to the necklace, so you may wish to keep the placket shorter than 5 rows).

**Row 1:** Sc in sc, 2 sc in 2-ch sp, sc in sc, 4 sc in 4-ch sp, sl st in sc, ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** Sc in next 5 sc, sl st, ch 1, turn.

**Row 3:** Sc in next 4 sc, sl st, ch 1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sc in next 3 sc, sl st, ch 1, turn.

**Row 5:** Sc in next 2 sc, sl st, ch 2, insert bead in hook, YO, pull thread through bead and loop, YO, pull through loop, sc in sc, fasten off.

### **Top Layer of Necklace:**

Using Cream thread, sl st in ch at top corner of lower layer of necklace (right side facing).

**Row 1:** Sc in next 3 ch, \*ch 6, sk 4 ch, sc in next ch, repeat from \* ending with sc in 3<sup>rd</sup> to the last ch. Sc in last 2 ch. Ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** \*[Dc in 6-ch loop, ch 1] 8 times, sc in next loop, ch 1, rep from \* to last loop ending with dc and ch. Skip 2 sc, sc in 3<sup>rd</sup> sc. Fasten off.

**Tip:** To seal off loose ends of thread, I use *Sew-No-More* fabric adhesive.

Fold the top layer of necklace over the lower layer right side facing. Block the piece before sewing the beads.

### **Sewing the Beads**

Using needle with very small eye, sew the beads to the crocheted lace following the detail photograph above.

For Top layer of necklace, use silver cup beads and effervescent cupped sequins. Attach the beads and sequins along the picots of the scallops.

For Bottom layer of necklace, use black cup beads and old rose pearl beads. Attach the beads on all the 3-dc clusters.

## **DIY: Crocheted Lace Necklaces**

The Layered Scallops Necklace is a variation of the Crocheted Lace Necklace that I made last year. These projects are based on the simple idea of turning crochet edgings and trimmings into jewelry using lace weight cotton thread, beads, sequins and other notions.

With antique patterns and stitch dictionaries as your reference, you can create numerous designs of lace jewelry such as necklaces, bracelets, anklets and hairbands. Experiment with color, threads and notions.
